PC/04/03	Crime & Disorder Crime Log Update Seventy four calls had been received by the police during the previous 6 weeks regarding incidents in Portbury and surrounding area. These included 19 calls regarding incidents at Gordano Services, 5 domestic incidents, 13 road traffic incidents, 7 safety related calls and one missing persons report. PCO Lewis also had cause to address youths riding scramblers in an unauthorised area – seizing one bike in the process.  Parking on the pavement outside of The Priory. This is causing serious safety issues to pedestrians and motorists alike. PCO Lewis will approach the Priory management to discuss this issue and see what solutions can be found. If illegal parking continues, the police will not hesitate in issuing tickets to vehicles parked illegally.

PC/04/12	S106 Agreement  Cllr Tarr updated the meeting on progress he had made with Richard Dowding, NSC's liaison officer appointed to assist him with this work, to review the Section 106 agreements relating to Moor Farm and The Ashlands new housing developments.  Moor Farm was the simpler of the two agreements and he had concluded from the review that the Parish Council should write back to Richard Dowding to request that the PC should be consulted on schools provision for an input into spending plans before decisions are reached (NSC has until November 2014 to spend this contribution). Cllr Tarr did not think that the PC would get far pressing other issues, including youth outreach provision, open spaces (where he had explored additional funding for the Pegasus crossing), highways and transportation, libraries, etc for reasons which Richard Dowding had explained (contributions approved for one purpose may not be spent on another; contributions are spent in the area where facilities will be used by the majority of residents and not just in the immediate vicinity of the development itself or restricted to one parish). There was however more to play for in terms of The Ashlands s.106 agreement relating to the Nature Reserve (completion of open spaces and ecology works prior to Avon Wildlife Trust taking management responsibility for it), land drainage, etc and he would continue to explore these issues with NSC officials through Richard Dowding.	
	The meeting remitted Cllr Tarr to proceed on this basis and to seek an early meeting with NSC officials to discuss the schools contribution.  The council agreed to pursue funding as advised by Cllr Tarr
