

<p>PC/05/03</p>	<p>Crime & Disorder</p> <p>(a) Parking in Portbury. Since April's PPC meeting, where this issue was discussed in full with PCSO J Lewis, the police have been pro-active in issuing warnings to motorists parked illegally. However, due to the timing of these police visits, the main recipients of the warnings have been local residents and not the patrons of the Priory Inn as originally intended, whose parked vehicles (mainly over weekends) causes access problems for neighbouring properties.</p> <p>Several residents who attended the meeting voiced concern over the parking issues within the village and the way that it had been handled by the local police. Various solutions were offered for discussion including double yellow lines in Station Road, residents' parking scheme and an overflow car park etc.</p> <p>The over flow car park was the option agreed to be pursued and the council would approach a local land owner and the management of the Priory to ascertain the feasibility of same.</p> <p>Proposed: Cllr Tarr Seconded: Cllr Weeks All in favour</p> <p>(b) Councillor Weeks advised that there had been two burglaries in Caswell lane; a break-in but nothing removed and a handbag stolen from another property.</p> <p>(d) Investigations in to illegal badger baiting within the village were still ongoing. Unfortunately the poisoned bait left for the badgers had been ingested by two dogs, one of which had subsequently died.</p> <p>(e) Cllr Tarr extended his thanks to NSC Travellers Unit whose swift response to a recent attempted encampment, in a field adjacent to Moorgate Farm, had led to the travellers being escorted back to the M5 Jct 19 within a number of hours. Security to the field has since been improved with the installation of a gate.</p>

However, the expectation of the council is that grass cutting would be maintained throughout the year and not just during the playing season. Cllr Meek would contact the club to confirm this and to agree a schedule.</p> <p>(b) Allotments. An allotment holder attending the meeting voiced their objection to the newly introduced ban on bonfires, adding that this was the most effective way to dispose of perennial weeds. Cllr Weeks advised that the ban had been introduced as a direct result of a resident's complaint - a bonfire had been lit without consideration to wind direction and that their home had been 'smoked out'. With regard to the planting of trees outside of the allotment boundary, it was noted that established trees already grow along the embankment and therefore a discussion with the owner/allotment holder would be required to agree if the trees should be removed or not.</p> <p>(c) The bus shelter situated at the end of the Sheepway is in a state of disrepair.
