	The Company hope to install solar panels etc on community buildings which not only would reduce utility costs for the users but also supply the company with an income from the Feed-in Tariff, this income would then be reinvested in future projects.				
	The Company would like to have the opportunity of formally addressing the residents of Portbury, as part of their plan to generate further income is to encourage members to become shareholders, similar to a cooperative.				
	The Council will review the information provided.

	(b) There had been several reported road traffic accidents; one involving thee vehicles close to Racecourse Farm, Portbury Lane. Despite the recently installed warning signs, it appears that drivers continue to speed and risk not only their own well being but those of others.

	(b) Stables Gypsy Lane. Stables have recently been erected and the Council have enquired as to whether planning requirements have been complied with. NSC DC enforcements have been contacted.	
	(c) NSC Town & Parish Event held 06.10.11. Cllrs Weeks and Marshall had attended this event on the Council's behalf. NSC are having to make huge cost savings over the next four years and are looking at which services, currently provided by NSC, can be adopted by parish councils. It would appear that Portbury already maintain services that many other parish councils do not; village lengthsman, allotments, street light electricity supply and maintenance. Any further provision of services would have a direct impact on the Council's precept requirements and insurance, this will obviously be discussed in greater detail should NSC make any formal proposal to PPC.	
	(d) Hinkley C Connection Update – proposed corridor. PPC feel that the proposed routing corridor for the new pylons is acceptable but still seek further clarification on the technical aspects and details of the final approach to the Portbury substation. Representatives from PPC will attend future meetings where these are to be discussed.

PC/11/10	Maintenance (a) It was brought to the Council's attention that contractors working on the A369/Jct 19 improvements are leaving rubbish, used paint canisters etc in the lay by. The Council will contact NSC to advise them of same and that should PPC have to dispose of this rubbish, NSC will be recharged for costs incurred.	PC

	 (b) Grit bins – PBS will contact NSC to ensure that bins have been scheduled in for replenishment. (c) Replaced man hole covers – It has been noted that when the new style covers have been fitted, the contractors are not removing debris but leaving it on adjacent verges. PBS will advise NSC. PC/11/11	Transport and Traffic (a) Cllr Marshall raised concerns regarding the impact that scheduled road closures for resurfacing in the adjacent parishes would have on the daily bus timetable. NSC would be contacted for clarification. (b) Re-routed footpath – High Street to Gordano Services. Further to this subject being discussed at PPC's October meeting, Mr Summerfield had received a response from NSC regarding the Council's request for the existing permissive path to be upgraded to 'footpath' status. The reply was not as positive as the Council had hoped and the item will be included on PPC's December agenda for further discussion.	PC
PC/11/12	Community Reports – St Mary's Church/School and Village Hall (a) Cllr Marshall thanked Mr Weekes for cleaning the church gutters and reminded the Council that the church would be holding its Christmas concert on the 18th December. (b) Portbury Village Hall – Company incorporation. Cllr Young advised the Council that the paperwork was nearing completion and that the incorporated company would be trading in the near future. It was agreed that the Council's representative (Cllr Marshall) would continue to attend PVH committee meetings. (c) Christmas Tree – As per previous years, the Council will purchase two trees (one for the Village Green and one for Moorgate), Cllr Cooke would also purchase a replacement solar powered light set.
