	a) The main crime during the month of April had been four car fires in the A369 lay by.			
	<b>b)</b> There had also been a theft from an outbuilding on the Sheepway. This was one of several in the area over recent months, and so residents are requested to be especially vigilant and to report any suspicious behaviour.			
	c) Cllr Hale advised that the culprits who had damaged the hides on the Portbury Nature Reserve, and who had been using them as a place for social gatherings, had been apprehended by the police.			
	d) Lay by A369/High Street – Due to inconsiderate parking by commuters who leave their vehicles in the lay by during the day, access and signage need to be reviewed and therefore this item will be included on June's agenda.

	<b>b)</b> National Grid – A residents' meeting had been held and a technical team formed to review NG's preferred routing option with regard to the compliance to the Holford rules and its effect on the village of Portbury. It is with this in mind that the team will request that when the consortium of local district councils submits its response in reply to the Environmental Service's scoping document, they specifically include objections made by the residents of Portbury.		
	During the data gathering procedure, a NSC document (2005) focusing on the planning area from the Clapton Valley to the village of Portbury had been uncovered. This document was in the process of being reviewed and it was hoped that there may be planning control recommendations which could be used when objecting to the routing corridor.		
	c) Enforcements – To maintain consistency in the reporting of planning non compliances to NSC, Cllr Cooke requested that councillors consider the implementation of an Enforcement Referral Document. This item would be included on June's agenda for further discussion.

	c) Village Hall Summer skittles would be commencing shortly; the skittle alley being booked every night. The recently held cider and beer festival was a great success and made a profit of approx £1300. The Community Café would be applying for a grant from the Lloyds TSB community award scheme.	
	d) Community Games and Play Area (heard after Item 2) Mrs Worthy, playground coordinator, updated the Council with details of possible equipment purchases to compliment those already in situ. Some items would be cost prohibitive but others, such as a basketball hoop and dedicated BBQ area, were all feasible.	
	Activity days during the school holidays have also been suggested, this would entail inviting a professional to give a demonstration of their chosen sport.	
	After last year's successful event, the community games will be held again on the 08.09.13. Cllr Cooke proposed a donation of £50 to assist in the purchase of consumables etc.
